My educational background is in linguistics (Kyrgyzstan), sociology (Poland) and anthropology (UK). Working in the academia (SWPS, University of Gdańsk and currently University of Warsaw), I studied collective identities and their discursive representations, as well as tourist practices. The interest in these topics resulted in a number of publications, including a book on niche tourism from Poland to the countries of former USSR (in Polish: *Konformizm, bunt, nostalgia. Turystyka niszowa z Polski do krajów byłego ZSRR*, Universitas, 2013). In the last few years my interests switched to migrants' leisure. I carried out fieldwork among Polish migrants in the UK and US (thanks to the fellowships granted by the Leverhulme Trust and Kościuszko Foundation) as well as among Vietnamese and Ukrainian migrants in Poland. Some of the findings were published in *Leisure Studies*, *Prace Etnograficzne*, *Urban Forestry and Urban Greening* and *Przegląd Socjologii Jakościowej*. I am currently involved in the project on the media and institutional reactions to the so-called refugee crisis in Europe in Hungary, Romania and Poland.
