

# Mary Erdmans

## Case Western Reserve University

Mary Patrice Erdmans is a Professor of Sociology at Case Western Reserve University. Her areas of interest are immigration and ethnicity (with a research focus on Poles and Polish Americans), the intersection of gender, class, and race (where her research has included studies of white working-class women and adolescent mothers), and narrative research methods. She is a former president of the Polish American Historical Association. Her monographs include: *Opposite Poles: Immigrants and Ethnics in Polish Chicago, 1976-1990*; *The Grasiński Girls: The Choices They Had and the Choices They Made*; and *On Becoming a Teen Mom: Life Before Pregnancy*. Her articles have appeared in various journals including the *Journal of American Ethnic History*, *Sociological Quarterly*, *Studia Migracyjne -- Przegląd Polonijny*, *Pamięć i Sprawiedliwość*, and *Polish American Studies*. Her current research project is an oral history of return Solidarity refugees. She is currently a Fulbright scholar in Poland affiliated with the University of Gdansk.
