Isabel Marcus is a professor of law and Director of International and Graduate Programs at the University at Buffalo Law School. She is one of the founders of the Institute for Research and Education on Women and Gender at the University. She served as chair of the Department of Women's Studies at the College of Arts and Sciences from 1997 - 2002. She is on the board of directors of the Network of East-West Women, an international non-governmental organization. She received her J.D., M.A. (African Studies) and Ph.D. (Political Science) from the University of California, Berkeley. Her longstanding research interests have been in the area of family law, domestic violence, and international women's human rights. Her current research project is a comparative analysis of the implementation of law regarding domestic violence in Eastern Europe and the former Soviet Union. She has been selected as a Fulbright Scholar (Romania 1997, Macedonia 2003-2004), a Fellow of the Bunting Institute, a participant in the Fulbright Senior Scholar Roster and an International Scholar for the Open Society Institute (Soros Foundation) Higher Education Support Program in Eastern Europe. She has taught extensively in universities in Eastern Europe (Poland, Russia, Lithuania, the Czech Republic, Serbia, Slovakia and Georgia) and Asia (People's Republic of China, India, Pakistan, and Thailand). She is currently teaching family law, comparative family, women's human rights, and selected topics in women's rights.
