Mark J. Rozell is professor of public policy at George Mason University in Arlington, Virginia, USA where he teaches courses on public policy, media and politics, religion and politics, and US national government. He is the author of nine books and editor of more than twenty additional books on such topics as religion and politics, media and politics, the presidency, and interest group politics. Among his latest books are Executive Privilege: Presidential Power, Secrecy and Accountability (3d ed., 2010), Media Power, Media Politics (2d ed., 2008), Catholics and Politics: The Dynamic Tension Between Faith and Power (2008), and Religion and the American Presidency (2007). He is co-editor of the forthcoming volume Fundamentalism, Politics and the Law and is the co-editor of the Georgetown University Press series on religion and politics. Rozell has testified as an expert witness before the U.S. Congress on several occasions on separation of powers issues. He has lectured extensively in the US and abroad, including in Austria, Denmark, Finland, Germany, India, Italy, Poland, Sweden, Turkey, and United Kingdom.
