

Power and

United States

Prof. Elżbieta Korolczuk



This course focuses on the history of civil disobedience and social movements in the post-World War II United States. In this course, our students will have the opportunity to become acquainted with key concepts and theoretical traditions in social movement research through cases such as the Civil Rights Movement, the women's movement, racist and conservative movements, Occupy, Black Lives Matter, and online mobilizations, including the alt-right and the #metoo campaign.

Politics in the Age of Social Media, Fake News, and Conspiracy Theories

Dr. Jan Smoleński



Free flow of information is a bloodstream of democracy. However, as recent events in the US and around the world demonstrate, it can be abused and facilitate the spread of fake news and conspiracy theories. The aim of this class is to explore the very topical issue and the critical role of social media in political mobilization, political polarization, and political decisions on individual and collective levels. By looking at various theories and case studies, students will investigate the potentials and limitations of the political use of social media as well as their multifaceted and ambivalent impact on democratic politics.

COURSES

American Graphic Memoir

Dr. Aleksandra Kamińska



What can autobiographical comics tell us about how we narrate our lives? Alison Bechdel, the author of the graphic memoir *Fun Home*, famously stated that "there is something inherently autobiographical about cartooning." The course examines what makes comics such a fitting medium for the most personal and intimate narratives. Analyzing both the format and the content of selected graphic memoirs, we study how gender, class, and race function within selected narratives and how those narratives operate within the broader American cultural context

American Science Fiction in the 20th and 21st Century

Prof. Paweł Frelik



Don't believe those who look down on it — there is no other genre that helps understand the now-and-here better than science fiction. In this course we learn how to decode fantastic figures, motifs and scenarios and discover what *The Expanse*, *Blade Runner 2049*, and *Cyberpunk 2077* say about out world. (We also mention *Transformers*, but — sadly — not in a good way.)

COURSES

America Goes to Ballot Box: the US 2024 elections

During the course, we examine one of the most important elements of American political and social life – elections. There are over half a million elective positions in American democracy, so elections are naturally controversial. If you want to know who wins American elections, how, by what means, when, and why, this is the class for you.

Politics of Hollywood Cinema

Hollywood may be the place where dreams come true, but it's also a powerful industry and a center for cinematic innovation and entertainment. In a course that combines scholarly analysis, great films, and exciting conversations students learn about Hollywood history, politics, and cultural theories relevant in its discussion.





RECRUITMENT 2025

Admissions to the BA Program

Admission requirements for the BA program in American Studies include, but are not limited to, a high school diploma and an appropriate grade in "extended level" English on the High School Leaving Examination. These criteria vary depending on the type of exam taken. Detailed admission requirements and application instructions can be found on the University of Warsaw's Internet Recruitment System (IRK) https:// irk.uw.edu.pl/en-gb/home/. To apply for our program, you need to set up an account in the IRK system, follow the instructions, and pay an application fee by the required deadline.


